Love this time of the year– everything looks gresh and green.

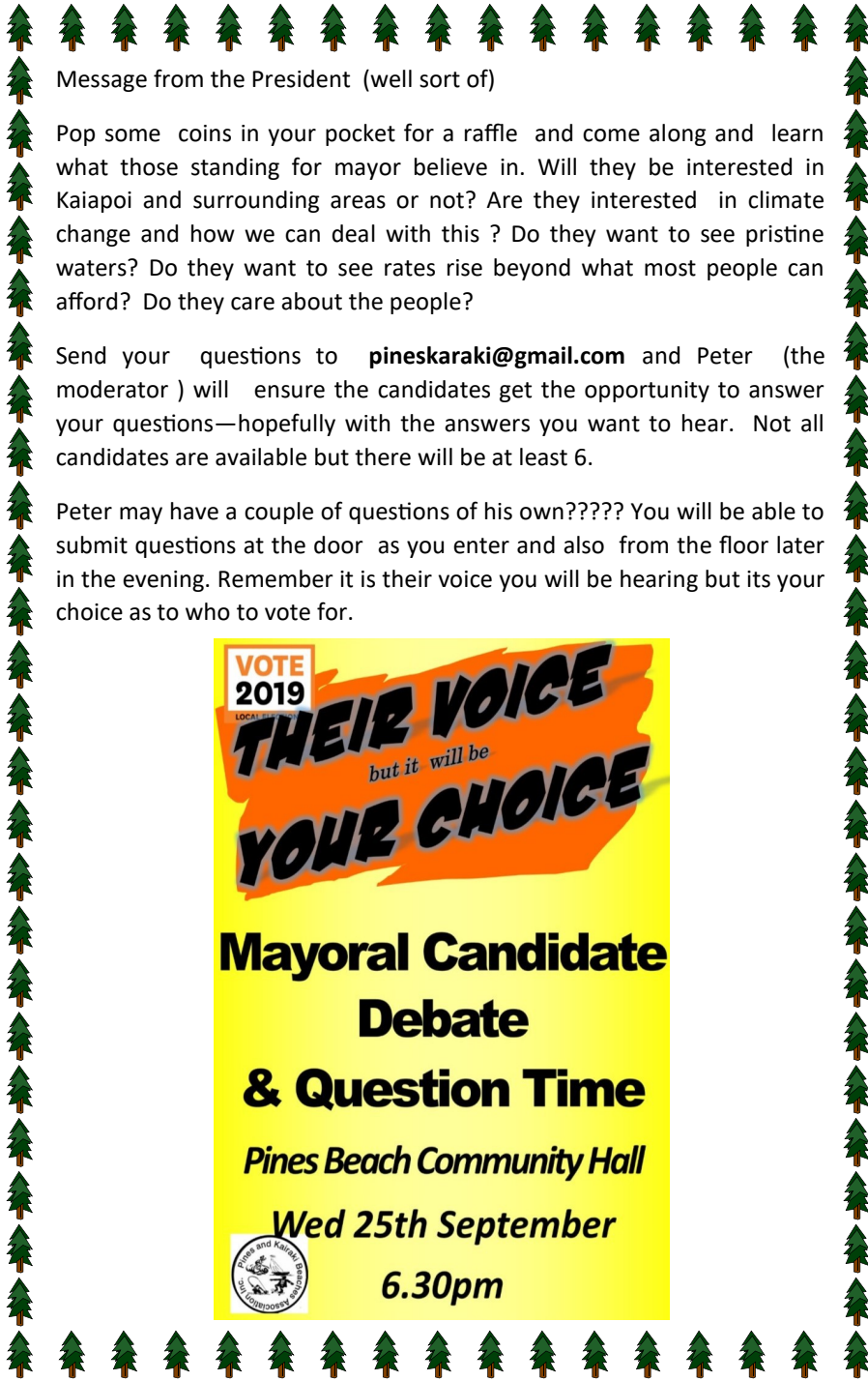
But ...roll on summer

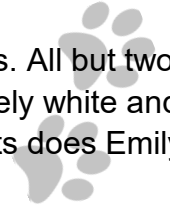

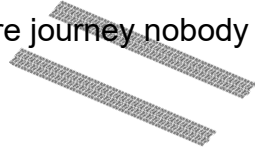
BRAIN TEASER ANSWERS

5. Emma was running in a marathon. With the end in sight she sprinted past Chloe who was in second place and triumphantly crossed the finish line.

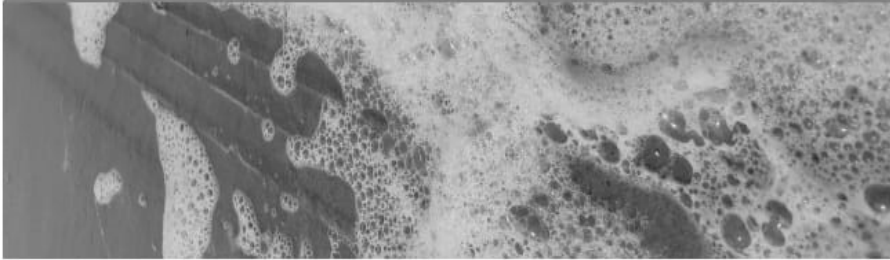

Sea Foam Sampling

Can you help us?



The Council is currently sampling sea foam in the areas between Kairaki and Woodend Beach.

Do you visit the beach regularly?

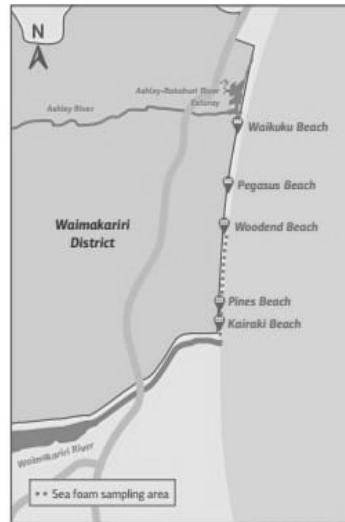
As sea foam occurrence is a natural phenomenon that is only occasional, we're looking for notifications and photos from members of the public if they come across sea foam.

Contact us on 0800 965 468 if you see sea foam that is:

- Within the Waimakariri District (particularly between Kairaki and Woodend Beach)
- On the sand (not sea foam on the top of waves - see photo above)
- Sufficient in quantity to fill a 1 litre sample container

The Council is examining the levels of *E.coli* and enterococci in the sea foam (bacteria that are used to indicate if there is faecal contamination) as part of an ongoing investigation due to public interest.

Notifications can be received at any time. However, after hours or during the weekend may not be responded to until the next day or tide cycle, due to staff availability and/or laboratory availability.
